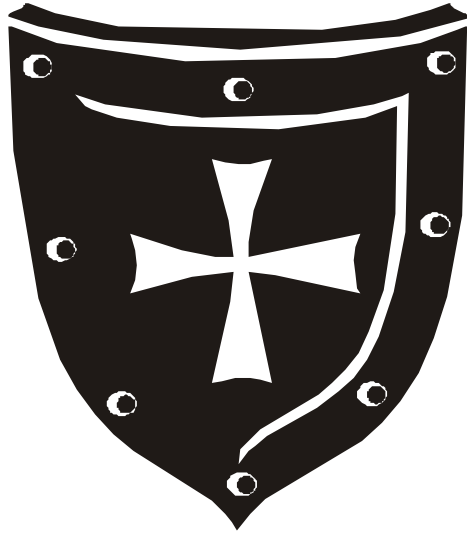
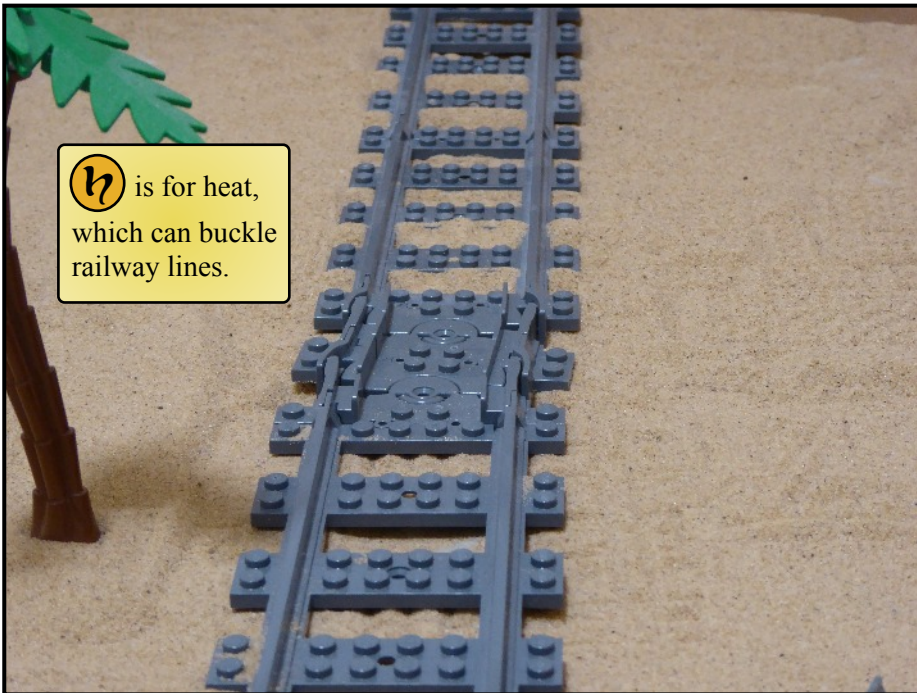


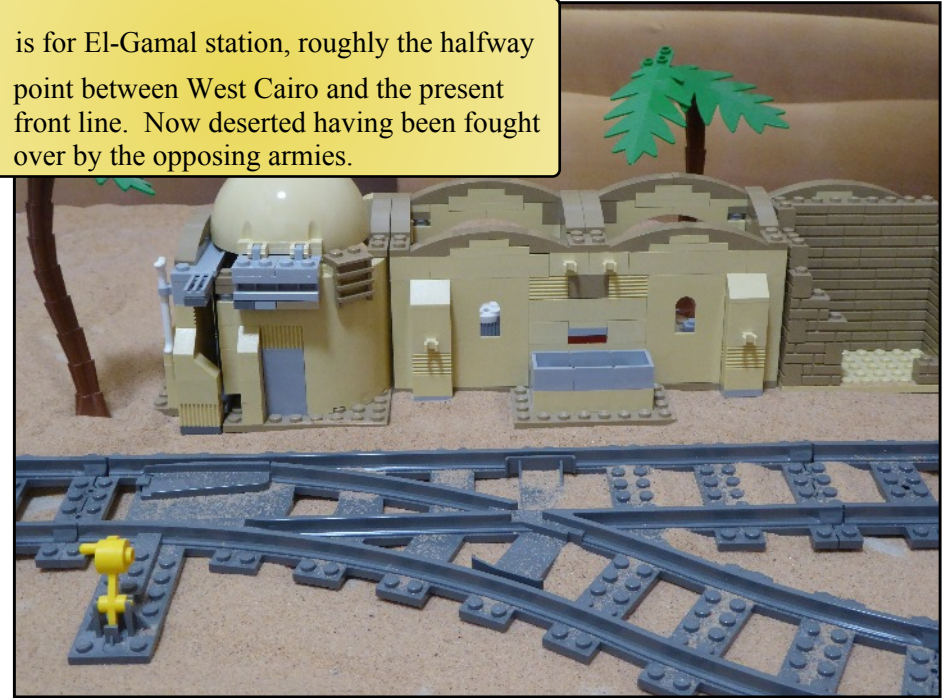
**F** is for Fritzrovia the Allies opponent in the Great War. A powerful European military country.
