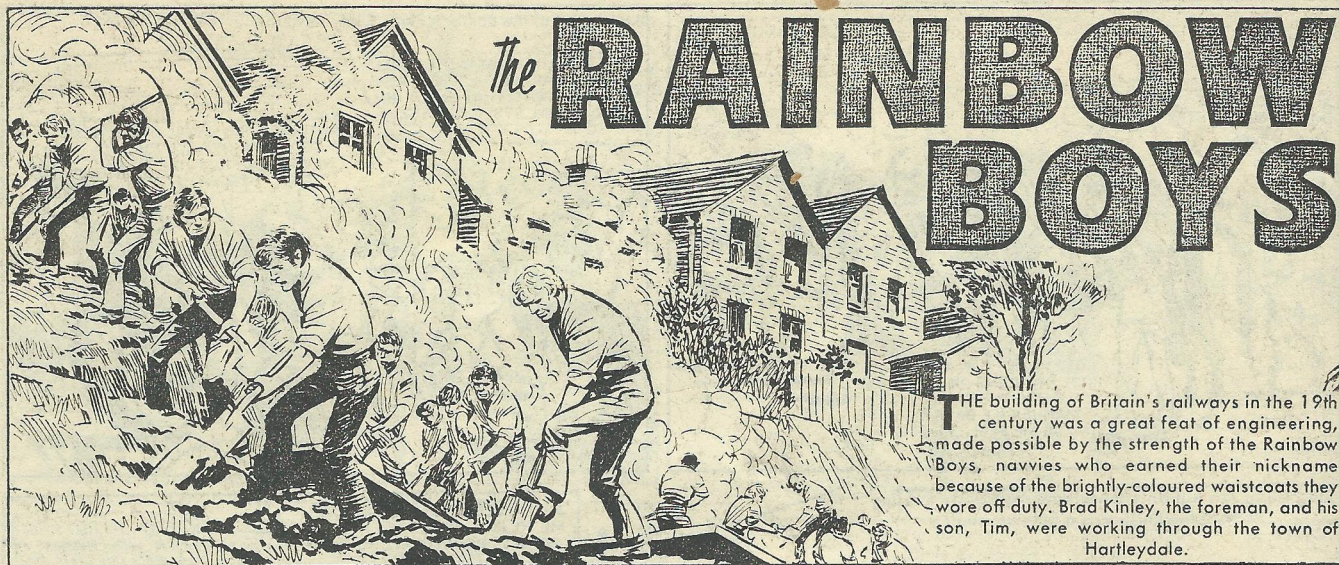


The Rainbow Boys raise a storm in Hartleydale — a dust storm!
