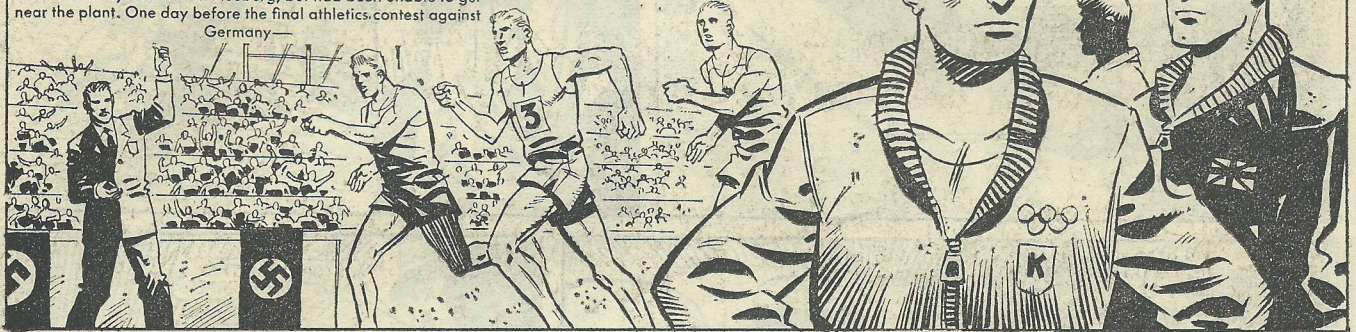


An enemy becomes a friend and that means trouble for Dicky.

ONLY MY BROTHER KNOWS I AM HERE! HE WOULD NOT BETRAY US.

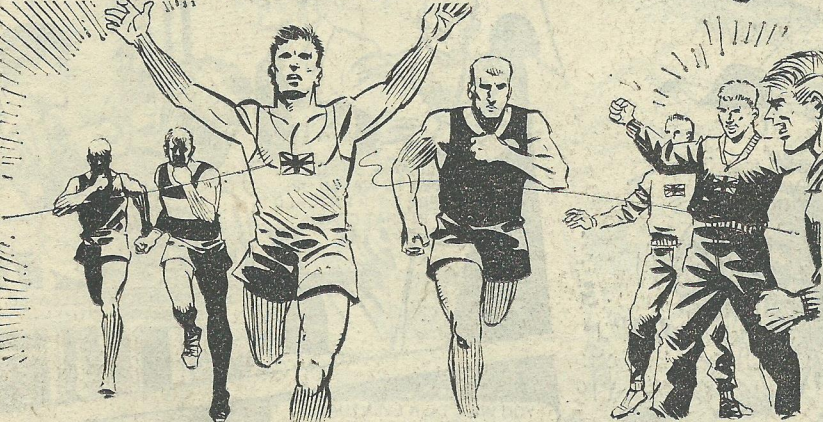
I HOPE WE HAVE A GOOD RACE. IT WILL BE OUR LAST MEETING.

AH, WELL YOU BEAT ME WILLIAMS. WE MAY MEET AGAIN SOME TIME.

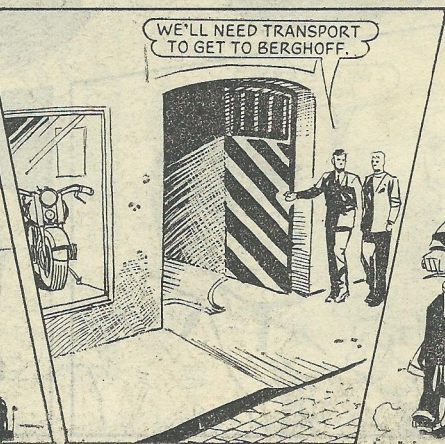
BY VON GUNTHER'S MANNER IT MAY BE QUITE SOON, AND UNPLEASANT AT THAT!
